### REPORT OF OFFICERS

VICE-PRESIDENT: The next meeting of the Wayne County Employees Retirement System Board is October 28, 2019, at 9:15 am, 28 W. Adams. Parking is currently an issue there. There is no Labor Coalition meeting scheduled at this time.

#### SECRETARY TREASURER

### **Financial Report**

Brother Macdonald reported that the Sub-Chapter has \$135,324.10 in cash and investments as of September 30, 2019. There are 1,300 current members with 187 participating in the PEOPLE Plan and (136) members were lost this calendar year.

Motion by Brother Macdonald, properly supported by Brother Sockolosky, to accept the Treasurer report as presented. The motion carried.

Motion by Brother Macdonald, properly supported by Brother Noelke, to adopt the Subchapter 38 - 2020 budget as presented based on a proposed membership of 1,225. The motion carried.

## Secretary-Treasurer Report, Comments and Announcements

Two Pending Arbitration Cases: There were three (3) grievances filed by AFSCME and its Local Unions relating to pension issues of which two (2) survived various court hearings and were remanded for arbitration. They are:

1. **Elimination of 13th Check:** The grievance dealt with the changes Evans and the County Commission to eliminate the funding of the 13th check, taking that money (\$32+ million) away from retirees and using the thirty-two + million dollars, in the "13<sup>th</sup> check account, as a required County contribution to the pension system.

2. **Medical Insurance for Disability Retirees:** For (30) years, the County had a practice which was supported by the various CBAs and the pension ordinance which provided that people who retired on a duty or non-duty disability pension were entitled to medical insurance as part of their retirement. In 2010, CEO Ficano eliminated this program and the Union filed an unfair labor practice and prevailed. The Sub-Chapter has been assisting legal counsel in preparation for arbitration. Considering the previous lengthy legal battles on these issues Legal counsel have agreed not to have evidentiary hearings on these grievances with all of the factual data stipulated by both sides. Should the parties not agree on the proposed stipulations, the arbitrator may rule on what stipulations to accept or order evidentiary hearings. Sub-Chapter 38 remains committed to assisting legal counsel during the arbitration processes. The stipulation process has not yet been completed.

## WAYNE COUNTY LAWSUIT TO SEAT EVAN'S BOARD

Wayne County CEO Evans filed a lawsuit against the Wayne County Employees' Retirement System Commissioners (WCERS) demanding the ability to seat his handpicked WCERS Board by expanding the Board to ten (10) members while eliminating one (1) active employee Commissioner and one (1) retired

member Commissioner. Wayne County Circuit Judge Leslie Kim Smith issued an opinion on July 31, 2017, denying Evans the ability to seat his WCERS Board. Wayne County filed an appeal with the Michigan Court of Appeals (Case No. 339714) and an appellate court decision; dated May 9, 2019 confirmed the ruling of Judge Smith. Wayne County has filed an application to appeal to the Michigan Supreme Court. WCERS and the Commission have filed arguments opposing the application for appeal. Wayne County had until October 4, 2019 to file a response brief.

## PRESCRIPTION CO-PAY SETTLEMENT

Payments by Wayne County of both Medicare eligible and Non-Medicare stipends appear to be consistent with the settlement agreement. The Sub-Chapter continues to pursue a grievance on the issue of the many problems with the Health Reimbursement Accounts at TASC (formerly Genesis). As a partial response the Sub-Chapter received a list from Wayne County of 996 HRA accounts at TASC with balances of more than \$3,000.00 totaling over \$3.5 million. It is evident that the only resolution to those grievances is a mutually acceptable Health Reimbursement Account (HRA) Plan and that every Medicare eligible class member know their rights and responsibilities under the plan. The Sub-Chapter is seeking a mutually agreed upon HRA plan or that at least a summary plan document be provided to every current and future Medicare eligible retiree. The primary problem is communication with affected retirees. Wayne County and the Sub-Chapter are both working on developing a communication plan. Since our meeting with Wayne County in July the county has not responded to inquiries about how to resolve our issues. As a result the Sub-Chapter is demanding arbitration in the hope of resolving those issues.

The 2019-2020 Wayne County budget included an appropriation of approximately \$450,000 for a Medicare eligible stipend enhancement for retirees with a pension of less than \$25,750. The CEO letter to the Commission that accompanied the appropriation included several pre-conditions. As of today the Sub-Chapter has not received any commiseration from the county concerning those pre-conditions. The Sub-Chapter is attempting to resolve the pre-conditions. An early estimate was that the enhancements would amount to approximately \$13.50 per month in twelve (12) installments for each eligible retiree class member.

### **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Health Insurance Services, the contractor that interfaces between Wayne County and TASC, has requested and been granted the opportunity to address the membership at the November 12, 2019 membership meeting about the group Health Care coverage plans available for 2020. The group plans are through AmWins.

Motion by Brother Sockolosky, properly supported by Brother Parker, to accept the Secretary's report. The motion carried.

Motion by Brother Noelke, properly supported by Sockolosky, to continue this year to provide a thank you luncheon in December 2019 for the Wayne County Employee Retirement System office staff. The motion carried. Brother Macdonald will contact the appropriate person to make the arrangements.

Motion by Brother Macdonald, properly supported by Brother Noelke, to continue this year to provide a holiday luncheon celebration for the members of the Executive Board at Sinbad's the week of December 16<sup>th</sup>. The motion carried.

Motion by Brother Noelke, properly supported by Brother Sockolosky, to accept the Trustee report as presented. The motion carried.

## Item4 referred from Correspondence:

After a review of President Yee's memorandum of October 3, 2019, in which he outlined the issues with Chapter 255 and gave a review of meetings and verbal agreements and the resulting refusal of the Executive Board of Chapter 255 to accept a resolution package to the retro-active dues situation, he is recommending the Executive Board and Membership agree to pay Chapter 255 retro-active dues to 2018. After much discussion, a motion was made by Brother McCall, properly supported by Brother Sockolosky, to pay Chapter 255, AFSCME, retro-active dues for 2018 and 2019. Motion carried by a vote of seven (7) Yes and two (2) No. The motion carried.
