READING OF MINUTES



SECRETARY-TREASURER:

Financial Report:

Brother Noelke reported that the Sub-chapter has \$224,542.01 in cash and investments as of April 30, 2022. There are 1,288 current members with 172 participating in the PEOPLE Plan and (79) members lost this year.

Motion by Sister Bauman, properly supported by Brother Sockolosky to accept the Treasurer report for April 2022 as presented. The motion carried.

REPORT, COMMENTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS: (Presented by Brother Macdonald)

The transition from TASC to MERS as the paying agent for Medicare eligible stipends is continuing with minimal problems.

The issue on medical insurance for disability retirees has not changed. The County has still not made any move to correct this situation in accordance with the arbitration award.

Motion by Sister Bauman, properly supported by Brother Sockolosky, to accept Brother Macdonald's report. The motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

PEOPLE Committee

Sister Bauman reported there were some screenings done in April and there are some screenings set for May. As soon as those are completed, it will be sent to Council 25 for their approval. When their list of endorsed candidates is released, we will make sure that information gets out to the membership.

Wayne County Sheriff Washington will be addressing Sub-Chapter at the Membership meeting today. Two other candidates have requested to address the membership at the June meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

President Yee requested the Executive Board accept for consideration, an Amendment to the Constitution for Wayne County, Michigan, Retiree Sub-Chapter 38 for Article VII – Duties of Officers and Executive Board – Section 9 – Special Committees. The current language requires the reappointment of all Special Committees and Committee Members every six (6) months. The Proposed language would amend this to three (3) years after appointments of said committees or upon the election of a new President, whichever occurs first. Such committees shall be deemed "Standing Committees" rather than "Special Committees".

Motion by Brother Noelke, properly supported by Brother Sockolosky, to refer this proposed amendment to the Constitution Committee for consideration. The motion carried.

GOOD AND WELFARE

Brother Macdonald reported that the lunch today will be provided by Empower, a subsidiary of Great Western. They have purchased the portfolio of Prudential Insurance and as such, will be servicing the Wayne County portfolio.

There was a moment of silence for deceased members.
